

LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW QUALIFYING CLASSES This Show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society (BSPS), affiliation 683, and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in BSPS Classes whether or not members of the BSPS are subject to the Rules of the BSPS including the disciplinary procedures and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS. This show is a qualifier for the London International Horse Show Qualifying Classes. **Only one pony in each of the following classes will qualify and the highest placed (not already qualified) from the first THREE ponies placed in classes 208-209, 210-211, 238-242.** Non-members of the BSPS have seven days to complete their registration and membership to keep the qualification. If not, this will pass to the next exhibitor.

BRITISH SHOW HORSE ASSOCIATION RISING STAR CLASSES **Conditions:** DIRECT QUALIFIERS FOR FINALS AT LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW Classes 200, 201 & 202 qualify for BSHA Rising Star Supreme Finals at the London International Horse Show, highest placed unqualified in top 5 to qualify. A results points table will run for all qualifying classes and a 'wild card' will be awarded to those unqualified with the highest points in each section following the final qualifier. Open to members and non-members, 15 yrs and over, eligible under Rising Star Amateur rules. Please note: Rising Star Amateur Rules 2024 are separate to BSHA Amateur rules. Please see the full list of Rising Star rules in the Rising Star section available on the BSHA website. www.britishshowhorse.org If in any doubt regarding your Rising Star Amateur status, please contact the BSHA Office directly to have your status confirmed. No competitor previously deemed a showing Professional / Producer, may be permitted to enter these classes. • JMB certificates will not be required to compete in these classes. • The Judge's decision is final. • The Judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes. **FINALISTS** A qualification card will be presented in the ring detailing how to confirm qualification and register with the BSHA. The BSHA will offer training clinics nearer the event to prepare all competitors before the finals.

NPS Summer Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB, or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part bred are not eligible unless over stamped into one of the British Riding Pony studbook sections. or the Ridden Register. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are

eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 6th – 8th August 2024. The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified. NPS/Corscaron Horse Essentials Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards MUST be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships

Trimming of whiskers - please be aware of individual society guidelines – for the avoidance of doubt within the unaffiliated classes, Bellingham Show follow the showing society guidelines which state Sensory hairs are the hard hairs located on the horse's muzzle and around the eyes, also known as 'whiskers' that are used for sensation. It is recommended that horses should not have whiskers trimmed or removed (other than for veterinary purposes or with a vet's certificate).

Equine Flu Advice

In keeping with the current Showing Council guidelines, Bellingham Show Influenza policy is as follows: Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all horses and ponies attending Bellingham Show. The requirement for the first three vaccination are as followed: The first two vaccinations 21 – 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter within 7 days of an EI vaccination. This rule may be subject to change from guidance from the FEI/ BEF and any changes will be notified via The Showing Council and ASAO websites.

Competitor numbers to be collected on show morning from the Chief Horse Steward.

The Society reserves the right to cancel, amalgamate or divide classes according to the number of entries. Judging times are approximate, variations may occur depending on the number of entries.

Complimentary Admission Passes for Equine Exhibitors are distributed in accordance with the number of horses or ponies entered and not the number of entries made.

- 1 horse = 2 admission passes and 1 vehicle pass
- 2 horses = 3 admission passes and 1 vehicle pass
- 3 or 4 horses = 4 admission passes and 1 vehicle pass

Body protectors to current standards are a requirement in BSPS working hunter classes and are strongly recommended in the other working hunter sections. The organisers of this show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective everyone in attendance must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers and all the officials and stewards.

Start Times Please note that there may be some traffic congestion leading up to and on to the show field, therefore please allow plenty of time to arrive and prepare for your class. **A timetable with start times/ not before times will be available no later than one week before the show on the website and our FB page.** Under no circumstances will judging be delayed due to the late arrival of competitors.

Pastry

280g / 10oz plain flour, plus extra for dusting
 1 small free-range egg, beaten
 1 free range egg yolk
 Pinch salt
 165g / 5 ¾oz unsalted butter
 30g / 1oz ground almonds
 65g / 2 ½ oz caster sugar

Filling

300g / 10 ½ oz ground almonds
 6 free range eggs, beaten
 139g / 4 ¾oz caster sugar
 Splash almond essence
 3 tbsp raspberry jam
 25g / 1oz flaked almonds

Method

For the pastry, place the flour, salt, sugar, butter and almonds into a food processor and pulse until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs.

Add the egg and egg yolk one at a time and pulse until a smooth dough is formed. Wrap the dough in cling film and chill in the fridge for half an hour.

Grease and flour a 23cm/9in loose-bottomed tart tin. Unwrap the chilled pastry and roll out onto a cold, floured work surface. (NB: this is a very 'short' pastry and at first will be difficult to handle).

Line the tart tin with the pastry and trim off any excess. Prick the base with a fork, then cover the pastry lightly with some baking parchment. Cover the parchment with baking beans or uncooked rice and place into the oven to bake blind for 15 minutes.

Remove from the oven and remove the baking beans or rice and the baking parchment and set aside to cool. If the pastry base is still a little raw, return to the oven for a minute or two to dry out.

Reduce the oven temperature to 165C/145C Fan/Gas 2. Meanwhile, for the filling, place the ground almonds and caster sugar into a bowl and mix well. Add the beaten eggs and almond essence and mix well.

When the pastry has cooled spread a generous layer of raspberry jam onto the pastry base. Pour the filling mixture over the raspberry jam to fill the pastry case.

Top with flaked almonds, then bake in the oven for 25-30 minutes, or until the filling is baked through and golden-brown all over. Remove from the oven and allow to cool.

1. Competitions and premiums in this list are all open, except Classes where otherwise stated.
2. Closing date for entries will be strictly adhered to, at the Secretary's discretion.
3. Animals obtaining premiums to be the bona fide property of their exhibitor.
4. When there is no competition prizes will not be awarded except where the stock exhibited is thought worthy by the judges.
5. Neither the Society, in any of its officers or servants shall be in any way responsible, or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstance whatever) to Exhibitors or their employees, or any animal or article exhibited, or property brought in to the Show field or otherwise for anything else in connection with or arising out of, or attributable to the Society's Show; or these in any other condition, or regulations prescribed by the society, in relation thereto.
6. No exhibit shall bear any distinctive marks or placard other than the society's official number.
7. Entry fees as stated in each section.
8. The Society do not hold themselves responsible or liable for any stock sent to the show, though every precaution will be taken to protect exhibitors from loss or damage.
9. All disputed questions shall be referred to the Show Council, by whom they will be finally settled without appeal. All objections to the Judge's decision or otherwise must be lodged with the Secretary in writing, within one week from the closure of the Show, accompanied by a deposit of £10 which is liable to forfeiture.
10. The Stewards shall have the power to order from the Show the stock or property belonging to any Exhibitor who shall infringe any of the regulations or conditions of the meeting, or shall refuse to comply with any instruction given by the Judges or Stewards.
11. All horses may be measured before entering the Judging Ring.
12. In no case shall a prize be awarded unless the Judges deem the stock of sufficient merit and the Judges will be specially cautioned not to award any prize to any animal showing signs of hereditary disease. The Judges may consult the Society's Veterinary Surgeon if they deem it expedient.
- 13. Horses must not be ridden around the Show Field in any circumstances.**
14. The Society reserves to itself by its Council the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed conditions and regulations or Prize Sheets and to settle and determine all matters, questions or differences on regards thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incidental to the Show. ***IMPORTANT* RULES FOR PAYMENT OF PRIZE MONEY.**

It is intended this year to pay out the Prize Money of Bellingham Show by cash on Show Day. Your co-operation is requested to follow these rules very carefully.

1. The Society will pay out Prize Money to successful exhibitors on Show Day, except to Exhibitors whose exhibits are sent by post and unaccompanied.
2. Successful Exhibitors of postal and unaccompanied exhibits will receive their Prize Money by cheque after the Show by post.
3. The Prize Money for the Sheep, Equestrian and Dog sections will be attached to the prize winning tickets and given to successful exhibitors when the Judging of the class is complete.
4. Exhibitors in the Baking, Industrial and Craft sections must complete prize claim forms.
5. Prize money will be paid out at the Secretary's office between 14.00 and 16.30 on show day to the successful exhibitors in the Baking, Industrial and Craft sections.
6. Only ONE EXHIBITOR may claim on a PRIZE CLAIM FORM, but it can be used to claim more than one prize.
7. The PRIZE CLAIM FORM, when submitted for payment, will be checked with the Official Prize List and, if correct, paid. The prize claim form can be retained by the Cashier as the Receipt for the Prize Money.
8. If any exhibitor is unable to collect their prize money they must claim by post on the official prize claim form.
9. If any Prize Money is not claimed on show day, it will be retained by the Society until the 30th of September of the current year after which date all claims will be considered VOID.
10. Claiming Exhibitors must be prepared to produce to the cashier their prize card as proof of identification.
11. PRIZE CLAIM FORMS may be obtained from the Stewards of the Secretary's Office.
