

In the event of cancellation by the Show Council, entry money will be returned, less a £5 administration fee. To make the show as safe as possible, please don't ride horses about the main show field.

Equine Flu Advice

In keeping with the current Showing Council guidelines, Bellingham Show Influenza policy is as follows: Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all horses and ponies attending Bellingham Show. The requirement for the first three vaccination are as followed: The first two vaccinations 21 - 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter within 7 days of an El vaccination. This rule may be subject to change from guidance from the FEI/ BEF and any changes will be notified via The Showing Council and ASAO websites.

Competitor numbers to be collected on show morning from the Chief Horse Steward.

The Society reserves the right to cancel, amalgamate or divide classes according to the number of entries. Judging times are approximate, variations may occur depending on the number of entries.

Complimentary Admission Passes for Equine Exhibitors are distributed in accordance with the number of horses or ponies entered and not the number of entries made.

- 1 horse = 2 admission passes and 1 vehicle pass 2 horses = 3 admission passes and 1 vehicle pass 3 or 4 horses = 4 admission passes and 1 vehicle pass 5 to 7 horses = 5 admission passes and 2 vehicle passes 8 or more horses = 6 admission passes and 3 vehicle passes
- Exhibitor e-tickets will be emailed prior to the show. Additional tickets at a reduced price can be purchased in advance.

Additional Passes can be purchased at time of entering classes at a reduced rate When jumping in the Ring, the practice or collecting areas, all Riders must wear protective headgear, according to the current standards as listed below: All PAS 015; VG1; (BS)EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards;

Skullcaps must be of, or worn with, a dark coloured plain peaked cover. Refer to your Society/Association Rule Book for further clarification.

Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet **one of the following** current Safety Standards/specifications MUST be worn by all Riders between the ages of 15 to 17 inclusive.

All PAS 015; VG1; **(BS) EN1384 2017**; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards.

The most recent updates to the list are the addition of SNELL E2016 and EN1384 (2017); the newest version of the SNELL Standard could have begun to appear in 2017 and is accepted to the list; the newest version of the EN1384 Standard will begin to appear during 2018 and is also accepted to the list.

Start Times Please note that there may be some traffic congestion leading up to and on to the show field, therefore please allow plenty of time to arrive and prepare for your class. A timetable with start times/ not before times will be available no later than 24 hours before the show. Under no circumstances will judging be delayed due to the late arrival of competitors.

Insufficient entries the committee reserve the right to amalgamate or split classes if necessary.

Parking All competitors must park as directed by officials. NO HORSES TO BE LEFT UNATTENDED TIED TO HORSEBOXES.

Alison's Chocolate & Courgette Cake from the Stay Strong Stu Cook

<u>Book</u>

150 g Dark chocolate - melted
175 g self-raising flour
½ teaspoon of salt
100 g caster sugar
150 ml vegetable oil
2 eggs
200 g peeled & grated courgette
a lined 8" cake tin or 2lb loaf tin
Decoration

Sift flour, salt & caster sugar into a bowl Whisk the eggs and oil together and add to the bowl – beat well Add the chocolate and courgettes – mix well Put in the tin and bake at 180°C for around 30 mins, reduce the heat to 150°C cover with foil and bake for around another 30 mins until cooked Cool in tin for 10 mins before removing it Decorate with chocolate icing / flake / buttons or in any way you wish.

- 6.No exhibit shall bear any distinctive marks or placard other than the society's official number.
- 7. Entry fees as stated in each section.
- 8. The Society do not hold themselves responsible or liable for any stock sent to the show, though every precaution will be taken to protect exhibitors from loss or damage.
- 9.All disputed questions shall be referred to the Show Council, by whom they will be finally settled without appeal. All objections to the Judge's decision or otherwise must be lodged with the Secretary in writing, within one week from the closure of the Show, accompanied by a deposit of £10 which is liable to forfeiture.
- 10. The Stewards shall have the power to order from the Show the stock or property belonging to any Exhibitor who shall infringe any of the regulations or conditions of the meeting, or shall refuse to comply with any instruction given by the Judges or Stewards.
- 11. All horses may be measured before entering the Judging Ring.

- 4. Exhibitors in the Baking, Industrial and Craft sections must complete prize claim forms.
- 5. Prize money will be paid out at the Secretary's office between 14.00 and 16.30 on show day to the successful exhibitors in the Baking, Industrial and Craft sections.
- *6.* Only ONE EXHIBITOR may claim on a PRIZE CLAIM FORM, but it can be used to claim more than one prize.
- 7. The PRIZE CLAIM FORM, when submitted for payment, will be checked with the Official Prize List and, if correct, paid. The prize claim form can be retained by the Cashier as the Receipt for the Prize Money.
- 8. If any exhibitor is unable to collect their prize money they must claim by post on the official prize claim form.
- 9. If any Prize Money is not claimed on show day, it will be retained by the Society until the 30th of September of the current year after which date all claims will be considered VOID.
- 10. Claiming Exhibitors must be prepared to produce to the cashier their prize card as proof of identification.
- 11. PRIZE CLAIM FORMS may be obtained from the Stewards of the Secretary's Office.
